MONTHLY REPORT

The Florida Silver Alert Plan is a tool which aids local law enforcement in the recovery of a missing senior who suffers from an irreversible deterioration of intellectual faculties. The Plan provides for activation of a State Silver Alert when a person meeting the criteria goes missing while driving a motor vehicle. Local agencies are encouraged to issue Local Silver Alerts for persons meeting the criteria when a vehicle is not involved. The following is a monthly report detailing State Silver Alerts issued by the FDLE Missing Endangered Persons Information Clearinghouse.

Recoveries: A **direct recovery** is defined as a person recovered due to the activation of the State Silver Alert, primarily through the use of dynamic highway message signs or other actions initiated by state agencies. An **indirect recovery** is defined as a person recovered through the actions of the local agency in coordination with the Silver Alert Plan, primarily through law enforcement communications or media.
